

As you are aware, our main school entrance is very small, and is extremely busy in the mornings when children are arriving at school. Please can we remind all parents that children may come into school from **8.50am**, but all children need to come into the school via the main playground (for Year 1 upwards) or the Reception and Nursery entrances. Please do not send your children into school through the main entrance in the morning.

<u>Children will only be accepted through the main entrance when they</u> are late, and the other entrances have been closed.

Children's entrances will be open until just after 9am.

NURSERY ADMISSIONS

If you have a child who is due to start Nursery in September 2019, you need to register NOW. Applications for a place in Nursery close at the end of this half term. If your child is in Pre-Nursery you will also need to complete an application form to let us know what sessions you will be needing from September 2019.

Headlice

Please can you check your children's hair regularly.

Kids Club

Please watch out for Kids Club holiday booking forms. Our Kids Club is incredibly popular and places go quickly. Please let us know if you do not need your Kids Club place, even if it is last minute. We often have a waiting list, and this would really help other parents. To avoid cancellation charges, please cancel Kids Club with at least two weeks' notice.



Collections from School during the Day.

There are times when you may need to collect your children during the school day e.g. dental or medical appointments. If you do need to collect children during the day, please be aware that our school office is not always manned during lunch times. If you are able to avoid collections from 12.30pm to 1pm, it would be helpful to us, and would prevent you waiting until another member of staff hears the bell!

If you do need to collect at that time, please let us know, and we will make suitable arrangements.

Attendance, Absence and the Staffordshire Code of Conduct

As you may be aware, following the legal court case regarding term time unauthorised absence from school. Staffordshire local authority's has issued updated guidance regarding the issuing of Penalty Notices for unauthorised absence. As a Staffordshire school, we HAVE to follow these guidelines. If you are considering taking your child out of school for a holiday please read the local authority guidance below.

Circumstances where a Penalty Notice may be issued:

- A Penalty Notice can only be issued in cases of unauthorised absence.
- Use of a Penalty Notice or formal warning of a Penalty Notice for unauthorised persistent lateness/absence will be restricted to one notice/ warning per parent of a pupil per academic year.
- There will be **no limit** on the times a Penalty Notice for unauthorised **leave** of absence can be used in an academic year.
- In cases where there is more than one pupil in a family with unauthorised absences, Penalty Notices may be issued for more than one child.
- The presence of an excluded child in a public place at any time during school hours in the first five days of exclusion.

Penalty Notices may be considered for *persistent* absence when the following is met:

• There are at least 20 sessions (10 school days) lost due to unauthorised absence during the current and previous term. These absences do not need to be consecutive.

Penalty Notice for leave of absence (holiday) in term time

• There is any period of absence not authorised by the Headteacher or in excess of the period authorised by the Headteacher. (e.g. family holiday)

Please do come and talk to Mrs Allbutt if you require any further clarification or have any questions about these guidelines.

Medicines in School

We have reviewed our medicines in school policy and have made a few changes to our policy. We remain happy to administer *prescribed* medicines in school. We will only accept prescribed medicines in their original container as dispensed, and will not be able make changes to dosages without confirmation from the original prescriber. Parents/carers need to complete a medical form. Copies are available from the office *or on our website*.



As we have lots of medicine to administer every day, we would appreciate it if you did not send in medicine that needs to be given **3** times a day, *unless your child attends Kids Club*, as this can be administered at home (in the morning, at home time and last thing at night).

In addition, we have reviewed our administration of paracetamol based suspension e.g. Calpol. We <u>will</u> administer paracetamol based suspension during the day. Again, parents must complete a medical form and clearly state the time of the last dose on the form. The school will inform parents **by text** of the time further doses are administered. It is the responsibility of the parent to ensure that the school has an up to date mobile number, and that the parent checks this information before further doses are administered at home. Staff cannot give a child under 16 aspirin or medicines containing ibuprofen unless prescribed by a doctor.

Scooters in School

Children are welcome to come to school on their scooter or bicycles.

Please can we ask parents to remind the children to walk down the driveway with their bikes and scooters, as riding down a steep slope full of children and parents is extremely dangerous.



Uniform

Our school uniform is designed to be flexible, reasonably priced and comfortable for the children. Children can wear burgundy or white polo shirts (with or without the logo), a school jumper, cardigan or fleece, grey trousers, shorts, skirts or pinafores, and the girls also have the option of a summer dress.

For your information, we still have *two* local uniform stockists where parents can by our school uniform. Uniform can be purchased from Supersports on the Macclesfield Road. Uniform can also be purchased from Kidwise. Although the Kidwise shop has now closed, the company are still trading online. You can purchase school uniform at https://kidwise.co.uk/. If you live

within 4 miles of Leek, uniform will be delivered free of charge (minimum order £10). Orders placed before 5pm will be delivered the same evening or the next day, depending on stock availability.

Please also remember that school trousers and white polo shirts (without a logo) can be bought from local supermarkets and shops. Some retailers provide very competitive prices.

Can we remind parents that the school PE Kit is burgundy T-shirt and shorts, and uniform items such as coats, hats etc are optional.



Text Service App

Our school text service has a new app which you can use to store and retrieve previous school text messages, and find out basic information, like term dates. Search the AppStore or Android store for Teachers2Parents. You will need to use the phone number registered with the school to access the app. Keep up to date with our Facebook page too!



You may have noticed the outdoor metal Toy Bank near the school garage. We are collecting your reusable plastic/wooden & soft toys which will then be exported to third world countries and socially deprived areas where people are unable to afford
