
The Christian ethos on which All Saints' is based underpins our vision and values, and the school maintains close links with All Saints' Church and the wider church community.

Our School

Our school is based on the outskirts of Leek near Birchall playing fields. We are lucky to have fantastic grounds and access to Ballington Woods behind the schools.

We have over 240 children on roll, from Nursery to Year 4, and an experienced and well qualified staff.

Our Nursery admits children from the term after their third birthday. We are able to offer universal Nursery places during the morning, and additional hours places during the afternoon for eligible parents. Parents who are not eligible for 30 hours free provision may also pay to extend their child's provision up to 30 hours.

Most of the children who attend our school move on to both the local Leek middle schools as well as local primary schools. As an academy, our school is part of The Talentum Learning Trust (TTLT), a local multi-academy trust working together to achieve the best outcomes for the children of Leek. We work closely with the other local schools within our trust, and with the other Leek and Moorlands Schools as members of the Leek Education Partnership.



Indoor Learning



Our classrooms are spacious and allow children to learn in a variety of ways. We have a dedicated Computer suite, which is used by children throughout our school. Other multi-media facilities include interactive white boards or ActivPanels in each classroom and a lighting and sound and video system in our School Hall which also acts as a computer and DVD projector.

We have our own school kitchen, which cooks hot meals on site every day.

All children have access to class sets of iPads, which they love to use creatively across the curriculum. We are lucky to have a hall which has super facilities for drama, a Community Room and a purpose built Nursery for our younger children.

Outdoor Learning

We have lots of space around our school. The younger and older children have their own playgrounds, which are well equipped with outdoor play equipment. We have big playing fields, a sensory garden and three outside classrooms, which are used as learning and social spaces. In addition to our sensory garden we have a horticultural garden, where we grow everything from flowers to vegetables.


Our early years have indoor/outdoor learning facilities through the addition of all weather decks attached to their classrooms. Our older children have a fantastic outdoor learning and play space, with climbing walls, leaning and play pods, outdoor exercise equipment, and even a quiet spiritual pod where children can spend time peacefully.

Our Mission




Our school will:


Responsibility

Responsibility is something everyone needs to learn. By helping our children develop responsibility we are helping them to reach their full potential.

Responsibility is involved making the right choices, being trusted, and learning to take the credit for one's actions - whether good or bad.

Everyone who works and learns within school aims to behave responsibly towards one another. At All Saints', to help children develop a sense of responsibility we first aim to be good role models.

Supporting children in understanding the consequences of their actions, talking through problems, and learning from mistakes helps children to act responsibly in the future.



Respect

All of us try our best to be respectful.

Respect is thinking and acting in a positive way about yourself and others.

That means treating others as we want to be treated and showing other people you respect them by acting in a way that shows you care about their feelings and well-being.

Showing respect for others includes things like not calling people names and treating people with courtesy. Showing respect for yourself means, for example, behaving in a way that keeps you safe.



Perseverance



The ability to persevere is a really important character trait for children to acquire, to enable them to live a life they can enjoy and can be proud of. Life is full of challenges and struggles.

Perseverance is the drive that helps us all to get past the hard stuff to get where you want to be. Developing perseverance in children means that we support them to wait and work through difficulties, whether they have to do with learning or emotions.

Confidence



Developing confidence is key to becoming a successful learner.

Our children develop an understanding of learning as a journey.

Confidence to give new things a go is vital to developing children as effective learners. We encourage our children and our whole community to develop the confidence to try out new things, and take risks with their learning.

Kindness

Kindness brings people together. Doing good for others feels good. Showing kindness towards others is just as rewarding as receiving it from others. Kindness improves our quality of life, and our experiences within school and within the wider world.

At All Saints' it is important that kindness is a value that is demonstrated by all who learn and work within our community. The 'Golden Rule', treat others the way you want to be treated', is so simple, yet incredibly relevant. Showing kindness within our learning is also incredibly valuable, whether it be supporting learning partners, working with younger children, helping others or working as part of a team. Learning to empathise reduces instances of unkind behaviour and improves social relationships.



Love of Learning

Love of learning describes the way in which we engage with new information and skills.

Love of learning is a strength that we try to encourage in all who learn and work in our school. It is an important motivator and it helps children to achieve their full potential.

At All Saints' we have designed our curriculum to inspire a love of learning. We love learning in different ways, whether it's learning outdoors, creating movies, learning through active play or visiting places to learn through first hand experiences. We also invite parents in to share our love of learning



Independence

Independence allows children to feel that they have some control over their own life and gives them a sense of self-esteem, both of which are important for developing a positive attitude towards school life. We want our children to develop as independent learners, able to continue their learning journey as they move on from our school.

Our children develop their ability to understand their successes and value their achievements, but also develop their ability to identify their own next steps in learning with increasing independence. We also encourage children to develop their own personal independence by having an infrastructure and routines which support children's independence whilst being appropriate to their age.



Creativity

Creativity is not limited to a single subject or idea. Creativity is thinking in an original, imaginative, expressive way, and is encouraged and nurtured across all areas of the curriculum and school life. Developing different ways to solve problems, find solutions and create new ways of looking at things. It's an essential skill in the modern world.



Teaching and Learning

We put our children at the centre of their own learning and place great emphasis on nurturing skills and encouraging our school values.

We believe in making learning inspiring so that our children love learning. Our curriculum has been developed to engage children by being relevant to their experiences and understanding, and develops children's skills by making links between subjects and giving children the opportunity to apply their skills and knowledge in a wide range of contexts. complements not replaces our core skills and creative aspects of learning.





The Curriculum



Our curriculum is based on a two year rolling program, which enables all children to access a broad range of activities and topics. Our philosophy is simple. We know our children. If we know what interests and enthuses our children, and we know where they are within their learning and what skills they have grasped, then we know what their next steps are. Lessons are planned around these next steps, and we differentiate learning to match the needs of the children within our classes.

Our talented teaching staff are supported by qualified and experienced teaching support staff who, along with the teachers, support children within classrooms, and also help to deliver planned and targeted intervention programs to children who would benefit from additional support in specific areas of the curriculum.

Kids Club




