INFORMATION ON THE NEW STATUTORY RELATIONSHIPS EDUCATION AND PSHE CURRICULUM.

From September 2020, Primary schools will be required to deliver relationships education in addition to Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE). As a result, we will be introducing a new PSHE (PSHE and Relationships Education combined) Curriculum in the Autumn term.

What does the new guidance mean?

The new guidance focuses on healthy relationships and keeping children safe in the modern world. It also covers a wide range of topics relating to physical and mental health, wellbeing, safeguarding and healthy relationships.

Learning about the emotional, social and physical aspects of growing up, it will give children and young people the information, skills and positive values to have safe, fulfilling relationships and will help them take responsibility for their own well-being.

All of the sessions will be age-appropriate and meet the needs of all pupils in the class.

How will this be delivered?

Relationships education will now be part of our school's PSHE education program which is taught throughout the school in every year group.

All teaching in PSHE will be underpinned by our school ethos and values.

What if I have questions?

To introduce parents to this concept and to ensure everyone is informed and feels comfortable with the changes to the curriculum, we have provided the full scheme of work and new PSHE curriculum policy on our school website. You can find out more about what your child will learn at each key stage, view example materials and resources being used in lessons and discover how you can best support your child to discuss these topics at home.
